Then over the course of a few weeks, we weighed ourselves on each scale several times in a row, using books, jackets, water bottles, and dumbbells to add and subtract different weights. We learned that some scales offer a seemingly manufactured sense of precision and accuracy by calculating your weight based on the memory of your previous readings rather than actually weighing you each time. To get accurate readings, you need to place the scale on a hard, flat surface and calibrate it every time you move the scale. In our testing, we gave each scale a maximum 0.2-pound margin of error, which means that if a scale weighed one tester at 120.0 pounds and they then got back on the scale with a 0.4-pound book, we considered the scale to be accurate if it said she weighed anything from 120.2 to 120.6 pounds. The Wyze Scale X stands out as an exceptional bathroom scale due to its accuracy, precision, and speed. In contrast to some other scales that may rely on memory rather than actual measurements, the Scale X was responsive to test weigh-ins involving various props. This suggests that it is well-suited for individuals who require precise weight tracking. Another advantage of the Wyze Scale X is its versatility. It can measure weights in both kilograms and pounds, making it accessible to a wide range of users. The scale also comes with a one-year warranty, providing peace of mind for those who invest in this product. While there are some minor drawbacks to consider, such as the slippery platform when wet or the risk of shattering, these issues do not significantly impact the overall performance and functionality of the Wyze Scale X. In fact, its reliability and accuracy make it an excellent choice for anyone seeking a trustworthy bathroom scale. For those who prefer a more traditional approach or have specific needs that are not met by the Wyze Scale X, the Tanita HD-662 is another viable option. This scale has been found to be just as accurate in our testing, with all measurements staying within a 0.2-pound margin of error. It also features a larger and brighter backlit display, making it easier to read weight numbers. Overall, the Wyze Scale X remains our top pick among smart scales due to its exceptional performance and range of features. Its reliability, accuracy, and versatility make it an excellent choice for individuals seeking a trustworthy bathroom scale that meets their specific needs. The EatSmart 550 Pound Digital Bathroom Scale is a fine choice for those in need of an extra-large scale, but it's not as accurate as our top picks when it comes to detecting weight changes within half a pound. We retested the previous top pick bathroom scale, the EatSmart Precision Ultra-Wide Bathroom Scale, and found it didn't reliably detect weight differences of less than half a pound. Similarly, the Ellison 2-in-1 Digital & Analog Weighing Scale struggled with incremental weight changes under ½ a pound. Among the Etekcity scales we considered, none performed as well as our picks. The EB9380H, EB4867S, EB4410B, EB4074C, and EB9386H all fell short in terms of accuracy. The Greater Goods AccuCheck Scale was also less precise than our top choices when it came to detecting weight changes under ½ a pound. While the Hopkins Medical Products EZ Carry 550 LB Digital Scale has a handle for easier transport, its lack of accuracy made it unsuitable for our testing. Similarly, the Inevifit Bathroom Scale offered an accurate display, but its less-legible design and higher price point may be drawbacks for some users. The Renpho Travel Scale for Body Weight received positive reviews from customers, but its compact size made it difficult to use during testing. The Taylor Digital Bathroom Talking Scale, on the other hand, was generally accurate and precise, making it a good option for those who need a scale that speaks their weight out loud. The Seca 813 Digital Flat Scale measured weights up to 440 pounds, but its higher price point and lack of saving past weights made it less appealing. The Taylor Digital Glass Bathroom Scale also struggled with accuracy during testing. Several other scales we considered performed poorly in controlled weight-adjustment testing, including the EatSmart CalPal Digital Bathroom Scale, Escali Bamboo Bath Scale, Greater Goods Bathroom Scale 0390, Ozeri WeightMaster II, and Taylor Digital Stainless Steel Bathroom Scale.
