To conclusively ascertain or settle something after reasoning, observation, or consideration can be described as determining. This process involves fixing or deciding causally, often leading to a conclusive decision or resolution. Determine can also mean to shape or influence, giving direction to, and experience often determines ability. When it comes to ascertaining facts about something, calculating exactly, or coming to an authoritative conclusion, determine is the suitable verb form. The origin of determine dates back to Middle English, from Old French determiner, which is derived from Latin dterminre 'to mark out and fix boundaries.' "The commission's safety staff investigates fires to determine whether the utility violated safety regulations." "Russell could determine which potential collaborators interpreted his writing as he envisioned it." Synonyms for determine include conclude, ascertain, settle, decide, cause, affect, control, fix causally, give direction to, and lead. The word "determine" has several meanings, including deciding something, determining who owns a piece of land, or learning something through investigation. It can also mean making a decision or giving direction to someone. In mathematics, it refers to fixing the position of an object, and in logic, it involves explaining or limiting by adding differences.
